Bitter Lake

Some reports of some nice walleyes being caught this past week. The water levels are considerably higher than the past few years. – Bitter Lake Lodge

Lake Traverse, SD/MN

Continues to produce and abundance of walleye and smallmouth bass. Despite cool temps and rain, fishing reports are good. Live bait still preferred. Warmer temps and sun will get bluegill/crappie/catfish bite started. – Wing N Fin Resort

Lynn Lake

Free Fishing Weekend was only for the bravest souls (or those with raincoats). The people that dared had decent fishing on Waubay, mostly 17-20 inch on minnows for now. Blue Dog was a go to lake over the weekend also. Lynn put out a few nice walleyes and small mouth. Looking for some drier weather for the upcoming holiday weekend. – Lynn Lake Lodge

The following report is provided by the SD Game, Fish & Parks:

Bluedog Lake – Anglers are having some success catching a few walleye and northern pike.

Cottonwood Lake (Spink County) – The walleye bite is hot. Limits of walleye have been caught.

Dry Lake 1 (Clark County) – Anglers catching smaller walleye off the road grade north of colony. **Do not park on the road.**

Dry Lake 2 (Clark County) – Fair amount of fish being caught during the evening hours. Bite has been good for walleye. 426th Ave to boat ramp is tough, use caution while traveling to the lake.

Goose Lake – Fishermen continue to catch walleye from the shore, with a short window of opportunity at night. The boat dock is not in, due to high water.

Indian Springs – Fair amount of fish being caught with a lot over 20". It's been hard to find walleye under 20 inches in length. Remember, only one walleye over 20 inches per angler per day. Use caution as boat ramp is still rough.

Lake Kampeska – Other than white bass, fishing has been slow.

Lake Poinsett – Fishermen are catching an occasional mix bag of fish from shore. **There is a 300ft NO-WAKE zone restriction around the entire lake.**

Opitz – A few walleye being caught at the boat ramp area and road to the south.

Roy – Slow, a few walleye being caught off main lake points and islands.

Twin Lakes (Spink County) – The walleye bite is picking up. Late evening is the best time.

Waubay Lake – Both shore and boat fishing has been good for white bass and the occasional walleye.
