

### **Fishing Update for The Missouri River in South Dakota**

It's more of the same with some rain in the forecast and also some sunny or partly sunny days coming up. Those good weather days will be so appreciated by everyone! Take advantage of the sun while it shines and get out on the Missouri River in Central South Dakota. Good luck catching!

**REMINDER:** Help stop the spread of Aquatic Invasive Species! Check out the [Game, Fish & Parks web site](#) for detailed info on the regulations. They are very specific so you'll want to be sure you've read the regulations. If you love to fish the Missouri River in South Dakota, please do your part to keep the reservoirs free of aquatic invasive species.

#### **[Lake Oahe](#)**

In the [Pollock](#) and [Mobridge](#) areas the fishing is picking up when the weather warms up. North of Mobridge is a little better bite but the bite south of town is starting to pick up a little. Anglers are using jigs and minnows or bouncer/spinner/minnow.

At [Akaska](#) the walleye are biting in the bays. Anglers are using jigs and minnows in 20-40 feet of water. Northern are also being caught from the shore. As the temperatures continue to heat up so will the fishing.

At [Gettysburg](#), anglers are starting to catch some walleye on the warm weather days. Depths are anywhere from 10-40 feet of water. All presentations are working. Some really nice northern are being caught as well.

Around [Spring Creek](#) / [Cow Creek](#) limits of walleye are coming in along with some smallmouth bass. The water temperatures are warming up, but rainy weather is still a factor. Northern and catfish are being caught in shallow water with smelt rigs. Some salmon action is happening along the face of the dam with anglers fishing in 20-40 feet of water.

### [Lake Sharpe](#)

Around [Pierre/Fort Pierre](#) anglers are catching walleye and smallmouth in 10 feet of water or less using jigs or bouncers and minnows or crawlers. With the spawn pretty much over it's getting easier to catch fish over 15 inches. Nice weather days are seeing limits of walleye, smallmouth, and catfish coming in.
