Fishing Update for The Missouri River in South Dakota

Temperatures should be in the 70's and 80's again this week, making for some potentially great fishing weather. Keep an eye on the weather and take advantage of the sun while it shines. Be sure to bring sunscreen and plenty of water when you're out on the Missouri River in central South Dakota. Good luck catching!

In the [Pollock](#) and [Mobridge](#) areas the fishing is good. North of Mobridge and up to Pollock is very good. Depths are anywhere from 16-20 feet of water. Bouncers and spinners with crawlers are the set-up of choice for many anglers currently.

At [Akaska](#) the walleye are biting in the bays. Anglers are fishing shallow in 5-10 feet of water, with all presentations currently working. Lots of good eater size fish are coming in. Northern are also being caught from the shore.

At [Gettysburg](#), the fishing is excellent. Some really nice smallmouths are coming in as well as lots of catfish. North and south of the bridge, anglers are spreading out and using all presentation in 5-10 feet of water. Shore fishing is great as well.

Around [Spring Creek](#) / [Cow Creek](#) the fishing is great and there's a lot of nice healthy, fat fish out there. Anglers are having good success catching limits in 5 feet of water or less out to 25 feet of water. All presentations are working well currently.

Lake Sharpe

Around [Pierre/Fort Pierre](#) anglers are catching walleye in 5-20 feet of water using bouncers/spinners and crawlers. Limits of walleye and smallmouth are coming in as well as some northern and lots of catfish.
