Fishing Update for The Missouri River in South Dakota

This week's weather is sunny and 90's most of the week. Maybe it will finally feel like summer is actually here! This should be a great week to get out and try catching some Missouri River walleye along with other species. Be sure to bring sunscreen, fly spray, and plenty of water, and good luck catching!

REMINDER: Help stop the spread of Aquatic Invasive Species! Check out the [Game, Fish & Parks web site](#) for detailed info on the regulations. They are very specific so you'll want to be sure you've read the regulations. If you love to fish the Missouri River in South Dakota, please do your part to keep the reservoirs free of aquatic invasive species.

To get there, go to <https://gfp.sd.gov/fishing-areas/> and click on the link for Public Fishing Access Map. You do have to zoom in on certain areas to see the boat ramp icons and they are up-to-date.

In the [Pollock](#) and [Mobridge](#) areas the fishing is really good. Right around Mobridge and up to Pollock is very good. Depths are anywhere from 12-20 feet of water, with 15-18 feet being the sweet spot for many anglers. Bouncers and spinners with crawlers are working well to bring in those walleye.

At [Akaska](#) the walleye are biting in the bays. Anglers are fishing shallow in 5-10 feet of water, with all presentations currently working. Lots of good eater size fish are coming in. Northern are also being caught from the shore.

At [Gettysburg](#), the fishing is excellent. Some really nice smallmouths are coming in as well as lots of catfish. North and south of the bridge, anglers are spreading out and using all presentation in 10-20 feet of water. Shore fishing is great as well.

Around [Spring Creek](#) / [Cow Creek](#) the fishing is very good. Higher water elevations make more area to fish. Bouncers or spinners and crawlers are working well for most anglers 10 feet of water or less. Bass and catfish are also biting, and the walleye are averaging 17 inches.
